DEATH AND OBITUARY NOTICES FROM THE SOUTHERN CHRISTIAN ADVOCATE 1867-1878

Issue of May 29, 1877

Sister Jane Jackson was born in Ireland, November 18, 1788; died near Palmetto, Ga., April 6, 1877.

She was brought to America when about six years old and located in Pendleton District, S. C.

She was married to Mr. Hugh Wardlaw who died in about six weeks.

She remained a widow seven or eight years then was married to Mr. Robert Jackson,

in 1821 they moved to Georgia and settled in Hall county and remained there two years.

Then they moved to Gwinnett near Lawrenceville, lived there about ten years then moved

to Campbell county and settled near where Palmetto is now located.

She joined the Presbyterian Church, and later the M. E. Church, South.

She leaves three children out of nine, and many grandchildren. (Robert has already passed)
